great, but the food was amazing. Early in the evening, anglers and guests were entertained by a dance squad from the hotel while a DVD provided by the World Championship was shown. Watching the incredible underwater footage of striped marlin taking baits was good motivation before wetting our lines. The evening was capped off with a solo by one of Dorado Pacifico's own door men, Freddy. Freddy did a wonderful job singing traditional Mexican music. We even had the benefit of seeing Ed Lynch and Jerry Yahiro swing a young senorita on the dance floor.

Last year our anglers had the misfortune of experiencing a slow bite. Everyone was hoping for good numbers this year.

Numerous anglers took to the water prior to the tournament with some catching as many as 4 sails in a day. Most anglers caught at least one or more and all reported some kind of action. Hopes were high for good numbers during this tournament.

DAY 1: While waiting for their boat on the morning of opening day one, fishing partners John Jackson and Smokey Molle heard a number of jests from the other anglers. "Looks like a lack of experience on this boat", "This

has to be a fix" and "Who paired these two?" John and Smokey did not disappoint. John landed 6 sails and Smokey landed two. After day 1 John led all anglers with 900 points earning top daily angler. Fish totals for day 1 were 34 sails. Daily first fish went to new angler Gary Fletcher. Last fish of the day went to Neal McNamara with just two minutes left in fishing time.

DAY 2: After a good day one we were excited about the prospects of another strong day on Tuesday. Turns out on Monday night the area had experienced a number of earthquakes centered off the coast south west of Ixtapa. The earthquakes clearly impacted the fishing with only 9 sails landed on day 2. Top angler for the day was Dave Holland with 3 sails earning 450 points. Dave also caught the last fish of the day. First fish went to Smokey Molle.

Wednesday the tournament hosted a Sunset Social in the Master Suite. A number of anglers were kind enough to donate their dorado to the cause. Jerry Yahiro prepared his amazing Sashimi and Poki. The hotel's chef, Daniel prepared battered dorado. With hotel employees Gregorio and Enrique bar tending and all the anglers and guests attending, it was quite a party. Thanks to everyone who contributed and participated.

DAY 3: There was much discussion in the day off about how the earthquake impacted the bite. Apparently this had happened during this tournament before. Anglers were hopeful the bite would return to what it had been on day one. Smokey Molle landed 3 sails and a dorado for 460 points to lead all anglers. Smokey also landed the last fish of the day. First fish went to new angler Jack Richardson. Fourteen sails were landed on day 3. There were reportedly two marlin hooked this day with both resulting in broken line.

DAY 4: The final day of the tournament produced 15 sails. Dale Miles 300 points took the daily high point. Nine minutes into his day, Jim Gill secured first fish of the day. With just 5 minutes left to fish, Dick Wallace caught the last fish of the tournament.

The fish totals landed for 2009 were 72 sailfish released and 6 dorado and 2 tuna.

At the end of the final fishing day the anglers and guests gathered at the El Mirador Restaurant to honor our captains and award the captain prizes. The overall Champion for the captains was Jose on the Angeles. Jose also received a Lamiglas rod for being the top captain on day 1. Other daily top captains were



Miguel Jr. on Rebelde, Jaime on the Albatros, and Jose on the Reigna Del Mar.

This year there was a special prize category for anglers fishing with Shimano Reels. Shimano, our main sponsor, donated two Tyrnos Reels to be given away in a Shimano specific prize category. The first reel went to new angler Gary Fletcher who caught the first billfish in the tournament on a Shimano Reel. The second went to Danny Brooks who caught the last billfish of the tournament on a Shimano Reel. Congratulations to these anglers and huge thanks to Shimano.

Congratulations to John Jackson, the 2009 Champion of the TAA Ixtapa Sailfish Tournament. John is a founding father of TAA. Previously he has won the East Cape Billfish Tournament 3 times in 95, 96 and 98. John also won the Tournament of Champions in 1983 and the International Roosterfish Tournament in 1986. Joining John in the winners circle was 2nd place Smokey Molle, 3rd place Neal McNamara and 4th place Dave Holland. This was a team of fine representatives of TAA for the 2010 World Championship.

I would like to extend a big thank you to everyone who helped out this year. The success of the tournament is in huge part due to the contributions of the participants and guests. The Dorado

Pacifico staff does an amazing job every year taking our tournament to a new level. Their commitment to constant improvement and first class hospitality is very much appreciated.

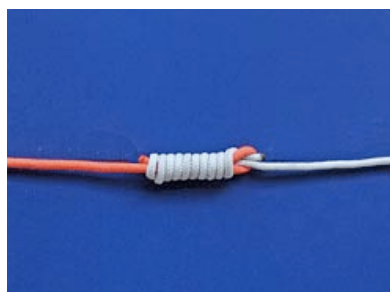

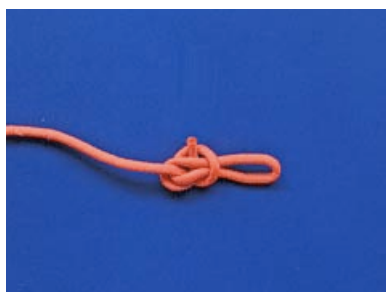

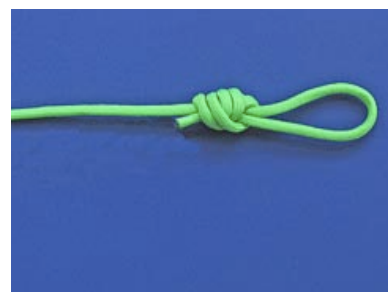
