#### <u>ANDY JOCOBI WINS</u> SAILFISH TOURNAMENT

Andy Jacobi, who recently took top individual honors at the Presidential Challenge, continued his winning ways by becoming the 2003 Ixtapa Champion with 14 releases for 2100 points. He edged out second place angler Jim Severson by 20 points. Third place honors went to Smokey Molle with 1970 points, while McNamara placed Neal fourth with 1800 points. These top four anglers will represent the Ixtapa Sailfish Tournament at the 2004 Rolex/IGFA Offshore Championship in Cabo San Lucas.

The 2003 Ixtapa Sailfish Tournament was a tremendous success, organized and managed by **Steve Davis** and **Jack Betts**. The fishing was excellent with an impressive 231 sailfish released. This was the highest release total since 1996.

The first day of fishing resulted in 64 releases. Topping the scoreboard was **Smokey Molle** and **Gary Lucas** with 5 releases each, followed by **Neal**

#### <u>CIRCLE HOOK</u> WILL BE REQUIRED

At the annual TAA Board of Directors, meeting in Ixtapa, it was voted to take the organization's conservation efforts and concerns to the next level. The use of circle hooks will be required at the Ixtapa Sailfish Tournament in 2004. The board also recommended that Eastcape anglers experiment with the use of the circle hook at the 2003 tournament, with possible implementation during the 2004 event.

The use of circle hooks has proven to reduce the mortality rate of billfish significantly, because 82% of hook ups are in the jaw of the fish. It has also

been determined that the number hook ups is not affected by the use of this style of hook. A number of tournaments, including the Presidential Challenge Events, have switched to the circle hooks and found no reduction in the number of hook ups.

The Rolex/IGFA Offshore Championship has required circle hooks since its inception in 2001.

Not all circle hooks are tournament approved. TAA will most likely follow the lead of the Presidential Challenge and the Miami Billfish Tournament in recommending only tournament-approved hooks. Please wait until you receive your 2004 Ixtapa invitation, which will identify the approved hooks before making your purchases.

McNamara, Alene Molle, Steve Davis, Peter Davis and Rocky Franich with 4 releases each. The daily high point went to Smokey who proved once again that the small game fish make a difference.

The second day of fishing saw continued action with 9 anglers releasing 3 sailfish each. They included Jack Betts, Peter Davis, Steve Davis, Mark Lottis, Neal McNamara, Dale Miles, Alene Molle, Jim Severson, and Smokey Molle. Smokey received the high point award once again by catching a

dorado. A total of 49 sailfish were released on the second day.

Day 3 of fishing turned out to be the most productive with 81 sailfish releases. High angler for the day was **Andy Jacobi** with an impressive 8 releases, followed by **Jim Gill** with 7, **Dave Holland** with 5, and **Dave Stroller** and **Jim Sev**erson with 4 each.

The fourth day of fishing started with numerous anglers within striking distance of top honors. **Jim Severson** was the High Point angler with 6 releases, followed by **Rocky Franich**, **Neal McNamara**, **Bill Evans**, and **Smokey Molle** with 3 releases each. Day 4 turned out to be the slowest day with 37 releases.

Top Teams were Peter Davis/Rocky Franich with 3020 points, Gary Lucas/Andy Jacobi with 3010 points, Neal McNamara/Mark Lottis with 2830 points, and Nora Schofield/Jim Severson with 2680 points.

During the awards ceremony the TAA recognized 17 anglers for their angling achievement with release patches. Most notable were John Jackson with 150 releases, Nora Schofield, Rocky Franich, Arlene Steiner and John Zehnder with 125 releases each, and Dave Stoller with 100 releases.

The Hotel Dorado Pacifico did an excellent job hosting this year's event.

Next year's tournament dates are January 17-23, 2004. Jack Betts and Dale Miles will Co-Chair the event.

TAA will field two teams to the 2003 Rolex/IGFA Offshore Championship. The event will be held May 10 to 16, 2003, for the second year in Cabo San Lucas. The two teams will consists of:
